

Charity road trip

VOLUNTEERS are being sought for a trip to help a school in Tajikistan next year.

In 2010, Ashley Platen-Mills, founder of Wimborne-based Charity Road Trips, led a road rally to an English school in Querghon Teppa, Tajikistan.

Now, he is planning to return to the school for a nine-day trip next May to provide workshops to give both the children at the school and the wider community new skills.

Ashley is looking for people of

The team already includes people to do business training, DIY, working with animals, a photographer, an IT trainer and a mechanic.

The trip will also give those involved time to explore an ecological project in the nearby mountains.
